PROCLAMATION.

On November 11, 1920 two years will have expired since the signing of the armistice which meant the end of the World War.

The event of which the eleventh day of November of each year will forever hereafter be remembered as the anniversary is one of the most important in the history of America and of the world. The armistice, says Foch " was tantamount to capitulation, and absolute capitulation." After years of struggle, agony and sacrifice it ended the saddest of all human experiences in the greatest victory of all time.

Now, therefore, I, Joseph A. A. Burnquist, Governor of Minnesota, in appreciation of the splendid valor and heroic devotion of the sons and daughters of our State who assisted in making the great triumph of human rights possible, do hereby proclaim
