TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY

COMMISSIONERS OF HENNEPIN COUNTY, MINNESOTA:

The undersigned, being more than twenty-five voters residing within the corporate limits of the village of Edina, Hennepin County, Minnesota, and also residing within and upon the following described territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of the Southeast quarter of section 7, township 28, range 24, thence running west along the south line of the Southeast quarter to the southwest corner of the Southeast quarter of said section 7; thence north through said section 7, township and range to the northwest corner of the South one-half of the Northeast quarter of said section 7; thence east to the Northeast corner of said South one-half of the Northeast quarter; thence south along the east line of said section 7 to the point of beginning, containing two hundred and forty (240) acres more or less, all according to the plat thereof now on file in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for the County of Hennepin, ~~County~~ State of Minnesota;-

respectfully show and petition your Honorable Board as follows:

That said village of Edina is an incorporated village; that the boundary lines of said village include not less than sixteen square miles of land, and that not less than fourteen square miles thereof consists of unplatted farm lands and farm dwelling premises, pasture and timber lands; that a part of such village has been platted into village lots or blocks, and that adjoining thereto there are lands so conditioned as properly to be subject to village government, not exceeding six hundred and forty acres, and that one ~~and~~ distinct and separate portion of said platted lands is inhabited as a village, which platted lands have a name by which they are known and called, to-wit, "Morningside; that the name "Morningside" is not the name of said village.
