
ORDER NO. II. PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION
FOR MUSKRATS.

WHEREAS, The Game and Fish Commissioner of Minnesota has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for muskrats and has furnished me with the results of such investigation,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Section 134 of Chapter 400, Session Laws of Minnesota, for the year 1919, do hereby find that the species of wild animals known as muskrat is in danger of undue depletion or extinction and that additional restrictions are necessary for the proper protection of the same, and

I do hereby order that on and after December 1st, 1920, no muskrats shall be taken, killed or had in possession in any number at any place in the state of Minnesota. This order shall remain in force and effect until the close of the 1921 regular session of the legislature of the state of Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
