## MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS.

By Mayor Hugo:

Whereas, On Oct. 4, 1920, there was held in the city of Duluth, pursuant to the Constitution of the state of Minnesota, a special municipal election for the ratification or rejection of a proposed amendment to the charter of said city, providing for an increase in the limit of tax levy from thirteen to sixteen mills on the dollar of assessed valuation on all taxable property in the city of Duluth, and

Whereas, On Oct. 4, 1920, there was held in the city of Duluth, pursuant to section 51 of the charter of the city of Duluth, a special municipal election for the ratification or rejection of a proposed ordinance providing for an increase in the fare to be charged by the Duluth Street Railway company, and for an increase in the wages of the employees of said company, and

Whereas, The judges and clerks of the several election districts of the city of Duluth, having made returns thereof to the city council and the city council having duly canvassed said returns in compliance with section 48 of the city charter and ascertained the number of ballots cast at the election held for the ratification or rejection of amendment to the city charter, and the number of ballots cast at the election held for the ratification or rejection of the proposed ordinance of the city of Duluth providing for an increase in the fare to be charged by the Duluth Street Railway company, and for an increase in the wages of the employees of said company,

Now Therefore, The council of the city of Duluth does hereby declare that at the election for the ratification or rejection of the proposed charter amendment there were cast 15,797 votes, 10,715 of which were in the affirmative, and 5,082 in the negative.

Now therefore be it resolved, That the proposed charter amendment having received more than 3-5 of the total vote cast at said election be and the same is hereby declared duly ratified. That at the election held for the ratification or rejection of the proposed ordinance of the city of Duluth providing for an increase in the fare to be charged by the Duluth Street Railway company, and for an increase in the wages of employees of said company, there were cast 15,804 votes, of which 7,563 were in the affirmative and 8,241 in the negative. That the proposed ordinance, having received less than a majority of the votes cast at said election, be and the same is hereby declared duly rejected.

Mayor Hugo moved the adoption of said resolution and same was declared adopted upon the following vote:

Nays—None.

WHEREAS, There was submitted by the charter commission of the City of Duluth on August 16th to the City Council of the City of Duluth, a proposed amendment to Chapter 8, Section 54, Subdivision 10, Paragraph 2, of the Charter of the City of Duluth, to-wit:

Amend Chapter 8, Section 54, Subdivision 10, Paragraph 2, so that the same when so amended will read as follows:

"The aggregate amount levied by general taxation in any one year for all of said funds, not including funds numbered one and two, shall not exceed sixteen mills on the dollar of assessed valuation of all taxable property in the City, and a levy in excess of such limitation shall be void as to such excess," and

WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Duluth did on August 23rd, call a special municipal election to be held on October 4th, 1920, for the submission of said amendment to the voters of the City of Duluth for ratification or rejection, and


WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Duluth, having canvassed the vote on said proposition and having declared that there were cast at said election 15,797 votes, of which 10,715 were cast in favor of said amendment, and also that

WHEREAS, The City Council has declared that said proposed amendment, having received in the affirmative more than 3/5 of the total votes cast at said election, the same was duly adopted.

NOW THEREFORE, I, T. W. Hugo, duly appointed and acting Mayor of the City of Duluth, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a true and correct statement.
