"The aggregate amount levied by general taxation in any one year for all of said funds, not including funds numbered one and two, shall not exceed sixteen mills on the dollar of assessed valuation of all taxable property in the City, and a levy in excess of such limitation shall be void as to such excess," and

THEREAS, The Council of the City of Juluth did on August 23rd, call a special municipal election to be held on October 4th, 1920, for the submission of said amendment to the voters of the City of Duluth for ratification or rejection, and
