

STATEMENT OF RESULT OF ELECTION
FOR CONGRESSMEN
1920.

I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, hereby certify that as shown by the official returns made by the State Canvassing Board of November 23, 1920, duly certified to me by the Secretary of State, of the vote cast at the last general November election for congressmen in the respective districts in this state:

Sydney Anderson was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the First Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Frank Clague was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Second Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Charles R. Davis was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Third Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

O. E. Keller was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Fourth Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Walter H. Newton was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Fifth Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Harold Knutson was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Sixth Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Andrew J. Volstead was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Seventh Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.

Oscar J. Larson was declared to have received the highest
