In the war torn countries of Central and South-eastern Europe, it is estimated that there are three and one-half million little children who are in danger of death through starvation, disease and cold. It is said that the sum of ten dollars will rescue the life of one child. Many of our people are so situated that they can give in sufficient sums to save the lives of a large number of these helpless and innocent children. Practically all of our citizens are in a position to give up the intended purchase of some luxury and contribute the amount of the cost thereof for the relief of the suffering and afflicted in these lands.

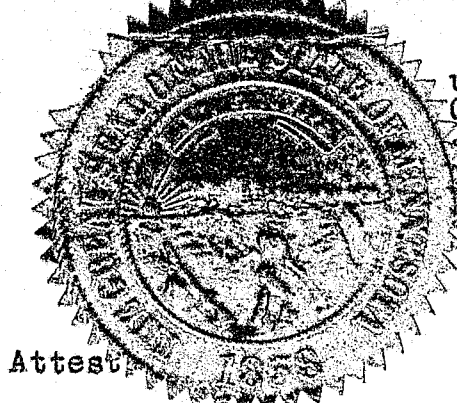
NOW THEREFORE, I, Joseph A.A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

SUNDAY

DECEMBER 19, 1920

as the first day of an intensive campaign to raise funds for the aforesaid purpose and urge that our citizens contribute to the extent of their ability to this worthy cause.
