PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, our Creator has bestowed upon the people of this Nation and this State immeasurable blessings among which are:

- A great material treasure to be used for man's needs and not his pleasure or glory;
- A rich environment to be cherished and preserved;
- An ever increasing reservoir of knowledge which can help man conquer disease, poverty, superstition and ignorance;
- A cohesion of national spirit directed at meaningful progress toward ending the conflict in Southeast Asia;
- A great spiritual heritage;
- A form of government vesting in the people the power to shape their own destiny;
