PROCLAMATION

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 19 - 26, 1971 as

"MINNESOTA STATE PORK WEEK"

and do encourage all citizens of our great State to enjoy pork and pork products, and urge all civic and business organizations, farmers, distributors, retailers and the news media to unite in promoting Minnesota-produced pork.
