Dear Sir:-

You will please take notice that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D. C., for the survey of those two unsurveyed Islands in Trout Lake, St.-Louis County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:

An unsurveyed island located in the Southwest portion of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19, Township 63 North, Range 15 West 4th P.M., containing approximately Sixty-five Hundredths (0.65) acre, more or less, lying about 517 feet North 23 degrees 26' East from the M.C. which constitutes the N.W. Corner of Lot 8 of said Section, and lying about 366 feet in a Northwesterly direction from the nearest main shoreline, which is on Lot 8 of said Section 19.

An unsurveyed island located in the Southern portion of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and Northern portion of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19, Township 63 North, Range 15 West, 4th P.M., containing approximately Thirty-five Hundredths (0.35) acre, more or less, lying about 1375 feet North 25 degrees 26' East from the M.C. which constitutes the N.W. Corner of Lot 8 of said Section, and lying about 500 feet South 75 degrees 50' East from the M.C. on the SW Corner of Lot 4, and about 390 feet West from the nearest main shoreline, which is on Lot 5 of said Section 19.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said two Islands should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
