through the Organization of American States and its predecessors, WHEREAS: the nations of our Hemisphere have learned a great deal about each other in these eight decades

WEREAS: the 1970's must therefore be a decade in which we achieve an increasingly vigorous, mature and balanced partnership, one which allows us to seek ever greater adventures and to realize even greater goals.

WHEREAS: the President of the United States of America has proclaimed Tuesday, April 14, as Pan American Day, and the week beginning April 12 and ending April 18 as Pan American Week

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do horeby proclaim Tuesday, April 14, 1971 as

and the week beginning April 12 and ending April 18, 1971 as

PAN AMERICAN WEEK
