- WHEREAS, the very existence of our society depends to a large extent on the profession of teaching; and
- WHEREAS, the vocational competence of everyone as well as his creativity and intellectual self-reliance are developed by teachers; and
- WHEREAS, our nation must have well-prepared and dedicated professional teachers who will prepare students for the demands of an age that already surpasses all others; and
- WHEREAS, teachers of our sovereign state as well as those of America are thus in a position to deeply affect the public and personal welfare of the nation and each of its citizens; and
- WHEREAS, for these and many other good reasons it becomes incumbent upon all of us to attract and retain the best of our youth for the profession of teaching;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the Month of April 1971 as

"TEACHING CAREER MONTH"

in Minnesota, in order to acknowledge publicly the importance of teachers and their accomplishments and to assist in providing the public support there must be if they are to continue in this rank.
