PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Z. E. Strong, a resident of the State of Minnesota, while trying to prevent the robbery of the United States mails upon a train on which he was a railway mail clerk, was, on February 18th, 1921, in Sherburne county in this state, shot and later died from his wounds, and

WHEREAS, public welfare demands that the person guilty of this murder and robbery be apprehended and punished according to law, and

WHEREAS, the United States government can only prosecute the charge of robbery of the mails, while prosecution for murder must be brought about under the laws of the State of Minnesota in the county in which the murder took place,

NOW THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of the State of Minnesota, will cause to be paid out of the Treasury of the State of Minnesota, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, for the arrest and conviction, or for information leading to the arrest and conviction, of the person guilty of murdering the said Z. E. Strong.
