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In the Matter of the Petition FINDINGS OF FACT,
for the Establishment of the CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, Thirty Lakes Watershed District. ORDER

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A nominating petition, initiated by more than fifty freeholders of the contiguous watershed area of Pelican Lake, Edward Lake, Long Lake, Lake Hubert, Clark Lake and other nearby lakes in Crow Wing County, Was filed with the Minnesota Water Resources Board, hereinafter referred to as the MWRB, on August 7,1970 , praying for the establishment of a Watershed District to be known as the Thirty Lakes Watershed District.

A similar petition signed by the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County was filed with said NWRB on August 17, 1970.

Both petitions state that the proposed Watershed District is needed as a means of conserving and making provident use of the waters and natural resources of the state of Minnesota within the territory to be included in the Watershed District and for such further purposes as described in the petition.

Both petitions stated the necessity for the Watershed District, asked for the appointment of managers thereto, and that the MWRB establish the boundary therefor.

Subsequently, a petition was filed with the MWRB on September 23,1970 , signed by a number of resident freeholders requesting the inclusion in the Watershed District, if established, of certain additional land in the ossawinnamakee area, as described in the petition. on September 28,1970 , a similar petition was filed with the MWRB by the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County.

Pursuant to order, the NWRB held a public hearing on the matter on october 20, 1970, at 10:00 A.M. within the territory of the proposed Watershed District.

Winston W. Borden, Attorney, of Brainerd, appeared for the petitioners;

Richard C. Ebert, Attorney, of Brainerd, appeared for persons objecting to the inolusion of additional land described in the petitions of September 23 and September 28, 1970;

William Peterson, special Assistant Attorney General, appeared for the Attorney General:

Present were all members of the Mimnesota Water Resources Board: Rector Putnam, George Grussing, Richard Caning, Harold Macy, and Charles Prior. Appearing with the Board was its Administrative secretary, Erling Weiberg.

Mr. Prior disqualified himself from any participation in the matter because he was an owner of land within the territory of the proposed Watershed District.

A number of persons appeared and were heard. The MWRB having heard the testimony and evidence offered and having duly considered the same, and all the files and records pertaining thereto, now makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT
I. A duly executed nominating petition, signed by 316 freeholders was filed with the MWRB on August 7. 1970, together with the required proof's of service thereof. A similar petition, signed by the County Board of Commissioners of Crow wing County, was filed with the NWBB on August 17. 1970, with proofs of service.
II. The Director of the Division of Waters, Soils and Minerals, Department of Conservation, on September 15, 1970, filed a written preliminary report with the MWBB, containing his recommendations on the matter.
III. On September 20, 1970, the petition being sufficient, the MWRB ordered a hearing thereon for 10:00 A.M. October 20, 1970, to be held at the Four Seasons Chalet, Star Route 2, Pequot Lakes, Minnesota, situated within the territory of the proposed Watershed District.
IV. On september 23,1970 , a petition was filed with the MWRB, asking for the inclusion of additional land in the proposed Watershed District, signed by a number of resident freeholders. On September 28,1970, a similar petition was filed with the MWBB by the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing county, Proofs of service were filed with the Board.
V. Due and proper notice was given to owners of all land affected by publication of the MWRB's Notice of Hearing, dated September 28, 1970, in the Brainerd Daily Dispatch, published in Crow Wing County.
VI. The territory of the proposed Watershed District is situated in the west central part of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, and encompasses approximately 70 square miles. The length of the proposed Watershed District from north to south being about 15 miles, the width from east to west being about 10 miles.
VII. The highest ground in the watersheds of Pelican, Long and clark Lakes is between I, 320 and 1,330 feet above sea level. The lowest ground is around the shores of Clark and Jong Lakes and is a few feet lower than 1,200 feet.
VIII. There are 26 meandered lakes within the proposed Watershed District lying wholly or partially within the boundary as petitioned for in the petitions filed with the MWRB on August ? and 17. 1970, namely:

IX. There are seven additional meandered lakes within
the territory sought to be included in the proposed Watershed District by the subsequent petitions filed with the MWRB on September 23 and 28, 1970. These lakes are:

X. Ossawinnamakee Lake (Long Lake) and its natural watershed, though contiguous, are located above, north of, and outside of the area of the land described in the petitions dated August 7 and 17, 1970, and are separated therefrom by a patural ridge located, more or less, east to west, along the north boundary lines of Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, Township 136 North, Range 28 West. Ossawinnamakee Lake and the lakes included in Paragraph IX above naturally drain into Pelican Brook,
which stream flows are easterly into the Pine River at a point in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 8, Township 136 North, Range 27 West. Pine River flows into the Mississippi River at a point in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, Township 136 North, Range 27 West.
XI. The territory described in the petitions of September 23 and 28,1970 , the ossawinnamakee area, (including the lakes in Paragraph IX above) are not within the watershed area sought by the petitioners in their petitions filed August 7 and 17, 1970, and are not a part thereof, being, in fact, a separate and distinct watershed area.
XII. A project was construated in 1938 to supplement the water supply of Pelican Lake by diversion of water from ossawinnamakee Lake into Pelican Lake. The project included the construction of a diversion channel between Ossawinnamakee Lake and Pelican Lake and a dam in the channel, which facilities are located in Sections 3, 10, and 11, Township 136 North, Range 28 West. Overflow from Pelican Lake discharges into Ossawinnamakee Lake and vice versa. The custody of the dam has been transferred from the Department of Conservation to the Village of Breezy Point.

XVII. The area incIuded in the original petition, filed August 7, 1970, includes seasonal residences, pernanent residences, and resorts as follows:

There is an additional number of seasonal
and permanent residences around smaller
lakes within the proposed Watershed District
not included in the above tables of lakes.
Part of the land is devoted to agriculture.
There are 50 pesort operations in the
proposed Watershed District, which operation,
is an important commercial venture. Seasonal
population is far greater than the permanent
population.
Part of the corporate limits of the villages
of Breezy Point and Nisswa extends within
the proposed Watershed District. The whole
area of the proposed Watershed District is
within the Crow wing County Soil and Water
Conservation District.
There have been permits issued for irrigation
Within the proposed Watershed District.
Some residents of the proposed Watershed
District observed in lab6 that pollution
was a threat to their lakes and were
being adversely affected for domestic
and recreational uses. Due to increased
riparian and water use of the lales, the
water in the lakes is affected with the
A. Silt is entering Pelican Lake from construction activity on the west and north shores of the lake. silt and parts of aquatic plants appear to be suspended in the lake's water. The clarity of the water in the lake has been decreased. The water of (North) Long Lake is being discolored.
B. There is a progressive increase of aquatic vegetation in recent years in Pelican Lake, (North) Long Lake, (Townships 134 and 135 North, Ranges 28 and 29 West), Lake Edward, and Lake Hubert. In recent years it appears that in Pelican Lake, aquatic vegetation has been cut by some landowners, a part of which has not been removed from the lake. Weeds that have been cut have floated up on beaches causing clean-up problems.
C. A greenish-brown scum, with an offensive odor, appeared across a wide portion of the surface of Pelican Lake in the Fall of 1970 and persisted for about three days. This appeared to be septic tank sewage in a high
state of decay. In october 1970 anarea of thick green scum was observedalong part of the shore of Lake Edward.D. Many private residences and resorts aroundPelican Lake are served by septic tanksand cesspools which are either notinspected, or are inadequately inspected.Some of the effluents from disposalsystems of dwellings and resorts onPelican and Long Lakes drain directiyinto the lakes. It has been observedthat septic tanks are still beinginstalled in low unsuitable sitesaround Pelican Lake.
E. Skin irritations and rashes, commonlycalled swimmers' itch, have beenreported as a mounting problem inPelican Lake and Lake Hubert.
Fo Some debris, including beer and popcans, has been washed on to the shoreof Pelican Lake in ever increasingamounts.
XXII. The lakes in the proposed Watershed District
are not being preserved for beneficial use
in that:
A. There has been a lack of effective,coordinated regulation of the useof the lakes of the area as to thedisposition of waste material andseptic tank effluent.

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        B. The regulation of lakeshore
        improvements by riparian
        owhers has been ineffective
        and uncoordinated.
XXIII. That Bass Lake in Sections 24 and 25,
        Township 135 North, Range 28 West and in
        Sections 19 and 30, Township 135 North,
        Range 27 West; Silver Lake, Section 18,
        Township 135 North, Range 27 West; and
        Taylor Lake, located east of Edwerd Lake,
        drain in an easterly direction, The lakes
        and their tributary land surface are not
        Within the proposed Watershed District.
    XXIV. The petitions proposed that the Watershed
        District be designated as the "Thirty Lakes
        Watershed District".
    XXV. The petitions requested that the proposed
        Watershed District be managed by five
        residents.
    XXVI. A suitable public facility for the principal
        place of business of the proposed Watershed
        District is not available within the territory
        of the proposed Watershed District.
XXVII. The proposed Watershed District Will be for the
        public welfare and in the public interest and
        the purposes of the Minnesota Watershed Act
        Wi11 be subserved by the establishment of the
        Watershed District.
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Upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board makes the following:

## CONCLUEIONS OF LAW

XXVIII. The MWRB has jurisdiction in the natter of the establishment of the proposed Watershed District.
XXIX. The public welfare and public interest will be served by the establishment of the Watershed District as proposed in the nominating petitions, filed on August 7 and 17, 1970, with the MWBF, and the puxposes of the Minnesota Watershed Act will be subserved by the establishment of the proposed Watershed District.
IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED
XXX: That the Thirty Lakes Watershed District is hereby established and given the corporate name of Thinty Lakes Wetershed District. by which name it shall hereafter be known, and it shall have all authority, powers, and dutiea as provided by law.
XXXI. The boundaxy of the Thirty Lakes Watershed District is hereby declared to be and is defined as a continuous Ine as described hereinafter:

## A. Crow Wing County

Commencing at a point of beginning at the northwest corner of Section 17, Township 136 North, Range 28 West, Sth Principal Meridian, in the Village of Breezy point, thence southerly in the Village of Breezy point on the west line of section 17 to the northwest corner of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter, section 17, thence easterly on the north line of the south half of the southwest quartex and on the north line of the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter to the northwest corner of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter, thenoe southeriy on the west Iine of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter to the southwest corner of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter, all in section 17:
thence in Section 20, Township 136 North, Range 28 West, from the northwest corner of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter, southerly on the west line of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter to the southwest corner of the northeast quarter of the portheast quarter, thence westerly on the north line of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter to the northwest corner thereof, thence southeriy on the west line of the southwest quarter of the bortheast quarter and southerly on the west Iine of the southeast quarter to the southwest corner of the southeast quarter in section 20 , in the Village of Breezy Point:

thence in Section 24, northerly and easterly, on the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. 3 in Section 24 and Section 13 in Township 135 North, Range 28 West, and in Sections 18 and 7 in Township 135 North, Range 27 West, to the intersection of the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. 3 with the south line of the north half
of Section 7; thence easterly on the south line of the north half of Section 7 to the southeast comner of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter; thence northerly on the east line of the west half of the northeast quarter in Section 7. continuing northerly on the west line of the west half of the southeast quarter of section 6 to the northeast corner thereof; thence easter ly on the south line of the northeast quarter to the east line of section 6 ; thence northerly on the east line of Section 6 to the southwest corner of the fractional northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section 5;
thence easterly on the south line of the fractional northwest quarter of the northwest quarter to the southeast comer thereof; thence north on the west line of the fractional northwest quarter of the northwest quarter to the north Ine of Section 5, in Township 135 North, Range 27 West; thence in Section 32 in Township 136 North, Range 27 West, northerly on the east line of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter to the northeast corner thereof; thence easterly on the north line of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter, continuing easterly on the north line of the south half of the southeast quarter to the east line of Section 32; thence northerly on the east line of Sections 32, 29, and 20 , to the southwest comer of the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 21 ;

thence northerly in Section 18 on the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. 3 to the south line of Government Lot No. 2 and of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter in Section 18; thence westerly on this south line to the southwest corner of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter; thence northerly on the west line of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter to the northwest corner thereof in Section 18; thence northerly in section 7 on the east line of Government Lot No, I in the south half of section 7 to the northwest corner of Government Lot No. 1 in the south half of Section 7; thence westerly on the south line of the south fractional part of Govemment Lot No. 2 in the north half of Section 7 to the west line of Section 7;

thence southerly on the west line of Section 3 to the intersection with the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. Il, thence westerly on the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. 11, and departing from the centerline of Federal Aid Secondary Highway No. 11 and continuing westeriy on the centerline of an unimproved road between Section 4 and Section 9 , Township 136 North, Range 28 West, continuing on the centerline of the unimproved road between section 5 and section 8 to the northwest corner of the east half of Section 8; thence southerly on the west line of the east half of Section 8 to the northeast corner of the south half of the southwest quarter; thence westerly on the north line of the south half of the southwest quarter to the west line of Section 8; thence southerly on the west line of section 8 to the northwest corner of Section 27 , the point of beginning.
XXXII. The territory of the Thirty Lakes Watershed District is that land located inside of the boundary line as described in Paragraph XXXI above. The territory includes all forth-acre tracts, which may be fractional; or tracts of less than forty acres; all government lots or parts thereof; and, all lots within platted areas.
XXXIII. The Board of Managers of the Thirty Lakes Watershed District shall consist of five residents of the Watershed District.
XXXIV. The members of the first Board of Managers of the Thirty Lakes Watershed District, Crow Wing County, who shall serve an initial oneyear term, the term beginning the date of this order, and until their successors are appointed and qualified, are as follows:
I. Mr. Donald G. Anderson, Star Route Box 298A, Merrifield, Minnesota, 56465 ;
2. Mr. Frank R. Grundt, Route 7, Ojibwa Park, Brainerd, Minnesota, 56401;
3. Mr. James H. Nolan, Route 5, Brained, Minnesota, 56401 ;
4. Mr. John J. Thomas, Route 5, Brainerd, Minnesota, 56401;
5. Mr. Donald N. Werring, Route 7, Brainerd, Minnesota, 56401.

# XXXV. The principal place of business of the Thirty Lakes Watershed District shall be located at Brainerd, Minnesota, 56401.
