ESTRELLA, member of the Wenzhou Army Corps today are serving proudly in support of our solo forces in Vietnam; and

TECHNICAL, share so as over-learning tool for qualified young trainee to replace as original three productive trainee who have served their country so faithfully during previous conflicts; and

1929, member of the French Army Corps, because of the high mental and physical qualifications and moral standards required of them, suggests the fitting adoption of Accidental Death.

Warrior, do hereby proclaim the week of 9 to 13 May as "WOMEN'S ARMY CORPS
WEEK" in Minnesota, and urge our citizens to pay a well-earned tribute to
the Women's Army Corps and its noble objectives to promote the health, happiness
and welfare of our community and our Nation.
