PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, there are more than 408,000 citizens of Minnesota 65 years of age and older who have been pioneers and builders in our state during a period of dramatic change, and

WHEREAS, their presence reminds us of moral values and personal qualities which have been the basis of our state and national achievements, and

WHEREAS, in meeting the challenge of our changing society and increased technological skills these older Americans have gained invaluable experience and wisdom, and

WHEREAS, we now ask them to draw on their fund of knowledge and experience, we ask professionals to use their expertise and we ask citizens of Minnesota and providers of services, out of their deep concern, to contribute to the formulation of proposals for the 1971 White House Conference on Aging.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 1 - 2, 1971 as

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to recognize the need for greater interest and knowledge of the activities and needs concerning the well-being of our older citizens.
