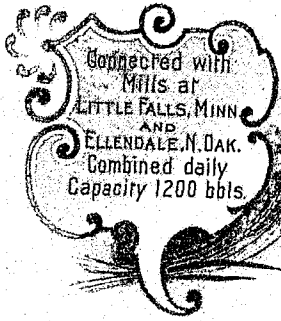

Ordinance Number 43.

The village council of the village of Red Lake Falls do ordain:—That the said village and all the territory by law now included therein, as described in chapter forty, of the special laws of the State of Minnesota, for the year 1881, entitled, "An act to incorporate the village of Red Lake Falls, Polk county, Minnesota," and all acts amendatory thereto, shall incorporate as a city, under, and in accordance with the provisions of chapter eight (8), of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota, for the year 1895, entitled "An act to provide for the incorporation, organization, and government of cities," and shall be, and become, subject to the provisions of said Chapter,

Ordinance Number 44.

An ordinance providing that the question of incorporating the village of Red Lake Falls as a city, under chapter 8, General laws of Minnesota for 1895, shall be voted upon by the electors of said village.

The village council of the village of Red Lake Falls do ordain:—That at the annual village election to be held in said village, on the ninth day of March, 1897, the question as to whether said village shall become incorporated as a city, under, and subject to the provisions of Chapter eight, (8), of the General laws of the State of Minnesota, for the year 1895, shall be submitted to a vote of the electors of said village.
