PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS: representatives of the Ukrainian people, as well as other Northern European groups with a common bond of heritage, language and culture, have sought to win international support for their role as free governments, and,
- WHEREAS: since the end of World War I, thousands of people from the Ukraine have come to America in protest against the rejection of their democratic aspirations in their homeland, and,
- WHEREAS: over the years, Minnesota has been enriched by these freedom-loving people coming to our soil, and,
- WHEREAS: those living in the Twin City area have traditionally observed "Ukrainian Day," an expression of support of the spirit of man in his quest for freedom,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, August 22, 1971

"UKRAINIAN DAY"

and urge all citizens who cherish freedom to support this community effort by joining their friends and neighbors in Minnehaha Park on August 22.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twentieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-one, and of the State, the one hundred and fourteenth.
