Transmitted herewith is a copy of Administrative Reorganization Order No. 6 executed pursuant to Hinnesota Statutes 1969, Sections 16.125, and 16.135.

In summary, the order transfers two vacant positions from the Department of Highways to the Department of Public Safety together with sufficient moneys to provide for an account technician and an accounting officer for the balance of fiscal year 1971.

These positions were previously identified as being subject to transfer in the report accompanying Reorganization Order No. 3 dated July 31, 1970. They will be funded for the balance of the year; 75% from the Trunk Highway Fund, which corresponds to the percentage charged to the Trunk Highway Fund for other Public Safety Administrative salaries.

The transfer will enable the finance section of Public Safety to both meet its immediate needs and free the director from day-to-day routine sufficiently for him to work on developing a comprehensive and integrated financial control and information system for the Department.

Attached 15 a copy of Recrychization Only 65. A executed on January 27, 1971 and transferring positions and appropriations from Highways to Public Safety.

The purpose of the order is to provide positions and funds for an account technician and an accounting officer to assist your finance section. However, I want to point out that the reallocation and filling of these positions must be processed and approved by the Department of Civil Service.

Nore importantly, this transfer is intended to provide sufficient assistance to your finance director so that no can spend the greater part of his time on the development of a central integrated financial control and information system for the department. To that end, we expect the Department of Public Safety Finance Section to commence whatever actions are necessary to develop a consolidated accounting and financial information system for the department as a whole which will be able to absorb increases in workload without requiring additional personnel.

This is related directly to the prior approval of financial personnel for the B.C.A. and the conditions that were attached at that time.

The Budget/OPAD divisions will do a follow-up study in about six months to determine what progress has been made, and a decision will be made at that time about whether or not additional reorganizations ought to be made.
