PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: the people of Minnesota demand the highest quality health protection from their physicians and public health agencies; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Health Immunization Program, public and private health agencies and private physicians throughout the state seek to deliver preventive health care to all residents of our state; and

WHEREAS: disease prevention and control through immunizations against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, measles, rubella and mumps constitute a primary and principle practice of preventive medicine;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 7 through November 13, 1971 as

"MINNESOTA IMMUNIZATION WEEK"

and salute the many dedicated professionals and volunteer workers throughout the state who have worked together to deliver immunization services to the people of our state. I further urge all Minnesotans to see that they and every member of their family are properly and currently immunized against all preventable diseases.
