PROHIBITION OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TRANSPORTATION BY CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN LOWRY HILL TUNNEL, CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS: CONTROLLED ACCESS HICHWAY USE ORDER NO. 50155

WHEREAS, under Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 169.305, the Commissioner of Highways has been given the authority to prohibit or regulate the use of any controlled access highway by any class of traffic found to be incompatible with the normal and safe flow of traffic.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commissioner of Highways, for reasons of safety, hereby finds it to be in the public interest to prohibit the use of that portion of Controlled Access Highway No. 392, renumbered 94 between a point 500 feet from the south portal and a point 1500 feet from the north portal and all that portion which lies beneath State Bridge Number 27832, which bridge is commonly referred to as the Lowry Hill Tunnel within the City of Minneapolis, by any motor vehicle or combination whose gross weight is in excess of 9000 pounds which is transporting hazardous material, as the same is defined in the provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Section 172.5, whether such material is being transported for hire or for the use of the owner of such vehicle. All traffic control devices relating to motor vehicles or combinations carrying hazardous materials shall have a white legend on a red background.
