IN SUPREME COURT

WHEREAS, Chapter 951, Minnesota Laws of 1971, provides for five judges in Anoka County Probate/County Court; and,

WHEREAS, this court was implemented November 1, 1971 and now has had approximately two months to assess and evaluate the case load; and,

WHEREAS, the four judges presently serving in said court concur in the opinion that said four judges presently serving can, by careful and diligent effort, adequately serve all of the duties, functions and responsibilities of this court; and,

WHEREAS, the Anoka County Board of Commissioners, pursuant to the recommendation of the chief judge of Anoka County Probate/County Court, concurred in by the other judges of said court and the provisions of Section 1, Subdivision 7, Chapter 951, Laws 1971, has recommended to the undersigned Chief Justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court that the number of county court judges authorized for the Anoka County Probate/County Court be reduced from five to four and that an appropriate order to this effect be filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That the number of judges for the Anoka County Probate/County Court, as provided for in Section 1, Subdivision 5 (1), Chapter 951, Laws 1971, be and hereby is reduced from five to four.
