Ordinance No. 50

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF NICOLLET, MINNESOTA, TO INCLUDE CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED UN-PLATTED LAND NOT EXCEEDING 200 ACRES IN AREA ABUTTING UPON THE VILLAGE LIMITS.

WHEREAS, a certain petition dated June 22, 1970, requesting annexation of the territory hereinafter described was duly presented to the Council on the i_0 day of July, 1970; and

WHEREAS, the quantity of land embraced within the area described in the petition and bounded as described is approximately 18 acres of unplatted land, no part of which is included within the limits of an incorporated city, village, or borough; and

WHEREAS, the petition was signed by the sole owner; and

WHEREAS, no objections to the annexation have been received from the town board, the county board, or the governing body of any municipality whose boundaries abut upon the boundaries of the land to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, the land described in the petition abuts upon the village limits at the southern boundary thereof;

THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NICOLLET, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Village Council hereby determines (1) that the annexation will be to the best interests of the village and of the territory affected; (2) that the territory described herein abuts upon the village limits and is about to become urban or suburban in character; and (3) that none of said territory is now included within the limits of any city, village, or borough.

Section 2. <u>Territory Annexed</u>. The corporate limits of the village are hereby extended to include the unplatted land described as follows, and the same is hereby annexed to and included within the village as effectually as if it had originally been a part thereof:

> All that part of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 10, Township 109 North, Range 28 West, lying southerly of the southerly right-of-way line of U. S. Highway No. 14, excepting therefrom the South 396.00 feet.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Filing</u>. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Minnesota Municipal Commission, the Secretary of State, and the County Auditor. Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance takes effect upon its passage and publication and the filing of the certified copies as directed in Section 3.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORORATE LIMITS OF THE VIL-LAGE OF NICOLLET, MINNESOTA, TO INCLUDE CERTAIN UNINCOR-PORATED UNPLATTED LAND NOT EXCEEDING 200 ACRES IN AREA ABUTTING UPON THE VILLAGE LIMITS
