

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS: The Constitution of the State of Minnesota provides that on February 22, 1972
- WHEREAS: It shall be the duty of citizens to exercise the opportunity to have their voices heard in the election of delegates to the caucus on February 22, 1972
- WHEREAS: The decisions presented at precinct caucuses held on February 22, 1972 will have a major role in the election of party nominees, and
- WHEREAS: It is the duty of every citizen to exercise the right of suffrage, and
- WHEREAS: The democratic process becomes ineffective if citizens, the electorate, fail to exercise their franchise, and
- WHEREAS: On February 22, citizens have the privilege of exercising this right by participating in the State caucus of the electoral process,

I, WENDELL R. ANDERSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, February 22, 1972, as

EMERGENCY CAUCUS DAY

and urge all citizens to inform themselves of the issues, decide which candidates best represent them, and vote for the delegates who share their concerns and convictions.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two and of the State the one hundred thirtieth.
