- WHEREAS: safe student transportation in school buses is extremely vital in today's high-volume traffic throughout the State of Minnesota, and
- WHEREAS: the vigilance required to reduce accidents is a big job for everyone, and
- WHEREAS: School Bus Safety Week underscores the vigilance, caution, and courtesy that must be exercised by every citizen in order for there to be any significant reduction in vehicle accidents, and
- WHEREAS: this program has been initiated for a three-fold purpose; to make safer drivers of the school bus driver, to emphasize the state law regarding when and when not to pass a school bus, and to help inform the general public of the importance that a school bus plays in the education program, and
- WHEREAS: the excellent safety record achieved by school buses in our State is worthy of recognition and commendation,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 17 through April 23, 1972 as

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge activities designed to increase public understanding and awareness of the significance of the pupil transportation program on a national basis to the pupil, the parents, the community, the state, and the nation.
