RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS: The Department for Rehabilitation through Education has, for the past 15 years, as the vocational education program of the State people, dedicated itself to the uplifting of individuals and of entire sections through its global network of vocational schools and institutions; and
- WHEREAS: nearly 700 such institutions, extending five continents, today provide tens of thousands annually with the modern skills that enable them to become independent, productive members of society; and
- WHEREAS: the State has, in this, its 92nd year of existence, pledged itself anew to increase its efforts to train all of those who desperately clamor for admission to its schools; and
- WHEREAS: Women's American WE, as the largest group in the world supporting the WE program, has set the local new goals for developing the network in Europe and throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS: Women's American WE has resolved to make the WE presence felt to a greater degree on the American scene and to emphasize vocational and career education as a crucial means of attacking the virulent social ills of poverty and alienation of youth.
