AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PERMANENT REGISTRATION OF QUALIFIED VOTERS IN THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON, MINNESOTA.

The City Council of the City of Worthington, Do Ordains:

Section 1.

Registration System Adopted: The system for the permanent registration of voters provided for by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201, is hereby adopted for the City of Worthington, Minnesota.

Section 2.

Voters must be registered: No person shall be permitted to vote at any election in the City of Worthington unless he is registered as provided by Minnesota Statutes.

Section 3.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication; except that the requirements herein adopted shall not apply to any election held prior to April 3, 1973.

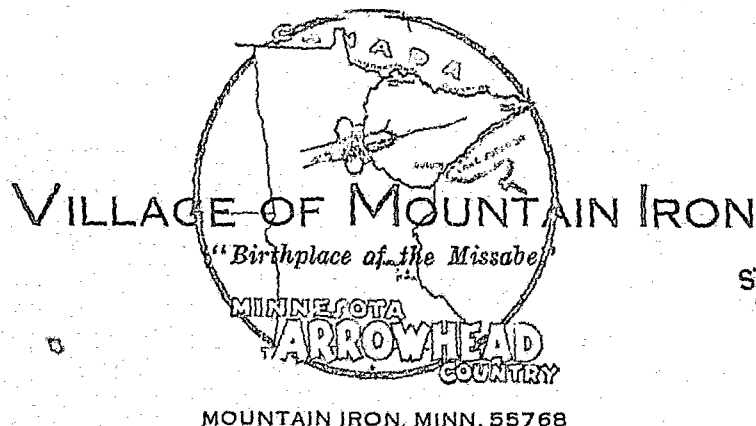

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PERMANENT REGISTRATION OF QUALIFIED VOTERS IN THE VILLAGE OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA.

THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: (Registration system adopted.) The system for the permanent registration of voters provided for by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201, is hereby adopted for the Village of Mountain Iron. The election judges in any election precinct in this Village shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 2: (Voters must be registered.) No person shall be permitted to vote at any election in the Village of Mountain Iron unless he is registered as provided by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201.

Section 3: (Administrator is Commissioner of Registration.) The Administrator is, in addition to his other duties, hereby constituted the Commissioner of Registration of the election precincts within the Village. He shall have complete charge of the registration of all voters in the Village, and shall discharge his duties in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201.

Section 4: (Effective date.) This ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.







AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND PROVIDING FOR A PERMANENT REGISTRATION SYSTEM OF QUALIFIED VOTERS IN THE VILLAGE OF HOYT LAKE.

SAY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF HOYT LAKE (ORDERS):

Section 1. Registration System Adopted. The system for the permanent registration of voters provided for by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201, is hereby adopted for the Village of Hoyt Lake. The judges of election in any election district in this Village shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Voters Must Be Registered. No person shall be permitted to vote at any election in the Village of Hoyt Lake unless he is registered as provided by Minnesota Statutes.

Section 3. Clerk is Commissioner of Registration. The Clerk of the Village is, in addition to his other duties, hereby constituted the Commissioner of Registration of the election districts located in the Village. He shall have complete charge of the registration of all voters in the Village, and shall carry out his duties in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and in no case open and after its passage, approval and publication, except that the amendments herein adopted shall not apply to any election held prior to January 2, 1971.

WHEREAS, the Township of New Scandia is a political subdivision within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, Section 201.02, Subd. 2; and

WHEREAS, said Township does not have permanent registration as provided for in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 201; and

WHEREAS, the 1973 Legislature amended Chapter 201 through Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 676, and through that amendment, did establish a permanent registration system wherein the County Auditor is the chief registrar of voters and the chief custodian of the official registration records in each county; and

WHEREAS, said chapter necessitates the registration of every person who will vote at any election; and

WHEREAS, every political subdivision which does not have permanent registration must accomplish such registration on election day; and

WHEREAS, this would create confusion and unreasonable delay on the part of many voters in order to accomplish the registration on that day; and

WHEREAS, the election by this political subdivision to establish a permanent registration system would be a convenience to the residents in that they would be able to accomplish their registration prior to election day as well as on election day; and

WHEREAS, the details and costs of accomplishing this permanent registration is borne almost entirely by the county and the State through the provisions as included in the 1973 Sessions Laws, Chapter 676.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Township of
New Scandia, under the power vested in it by Minnesota Statutes,
Section 201.21, Subd. 2, does hereby establish a permanent
voter registration system and does thereby elect to come
under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 201.061,
Subd. 1.
