- WHEREAS: over 400 School Volunteers are working in our St. Paul schools, and these Volunteers give at least one-half day a week to help children with reading, mathematics and other basic subjects on a one-to-one basis under the guidance of the classroom teacher, and
- WHEREAS: Volunteers also help to organize and operate school libraries, make curriculum more relevant by introducing extra programs in social studies, creative drama, minority history and creative writing, and
- WHEREAS: these Volunteers contribute time, love, skills and special expertise to the educational process, and
- WHEREAS: the purpose of the "VIP". (Volunteers in Participation Program) is to better the child's picture of himself, to enrich his life experience, and to promote greater school-community involvement, and
- WHEREAS: the requirements to become a School Volunteer are a love of children and a commitment to accept the challenge to be present each week throughout the school year, and
- WHEREAS: the development of our human resources is the single, greatest challenge of our time, and perhaps the best means of insuring the survival and growth of this great country of ours.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 2 - 9, 1972 as
