ORDINANCE NO. 1-1972

AN ORDINANCE EXPANDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF BROWNSDALE TO INCLUDE CERTAIN UNPLATTED LAND NOT EXCEEDING 200 ACRES IN AREA ADJACENT UPON THE VILLAGE LIMITS.

WHEREAS, a certain petition dated Dec. 6, 1971, requesting annexation of the territory hereinafter described was duly presented to the council on the 6 day of Dec., 1971; and

WHEREAS, the quantity of land embraced within the area described in the petition and bounded as described is less than 200 acres of unplatted land, no part of which is included within the limits of an incorporated city, village, or borough; and

WHEREAS, the petition was signed by the sole owner, and

WHEREAS, no objections to the annexation have been received from the town board, the county board, or the governing body of any municipality whose boundaries of land to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, the land described in the petition abuts upon the village limits at the southwest boundary thereof;

The council of the Village of Brownsdale, Minnesota, ordains:

Section 1. The village council hereby determines (1) that the annexation will be to the best interests of the village and of the territory affected; (2) that the territory described herein abuts upon the village limits and is about to become urban or suburban in character; and (3) that none of said territory is now included within the limits of any city, village, or borough.

Section 2. Territory Annexed. The corporate limits of the village are hereby extended to include the unplatted land described as follows and the same is hereby annexed to and included within the village as effectually as if it had originally been


a part thereof:

That part of Outlet 49 commencing at a point 12 rods south of the Northwest corner of Outlet 51, thence West 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to the point of beginning; thence West 461.43 ft., thence South 1 degree 19 minutes East to the North line of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad; thence Northeasterly along said line of the Railroad to a point 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods West of the East line of Outlet 49 and on the North line of said Railroad; thence North to the point of beginning, containing 7.5 acres more or less, all in the N.E. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Section 9, T103N, R17W, Hower County, Minn.


Section 3. Filing. The village Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Minnesota Municipal Commission, the Secretary of State, and the County Auditor.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance takes effect upon its passage and publication and the filing of the certified copies as directed in Section 3.


