ORDER FOR RETIREMENT

WHEREAS, The Honorable Charles A. Fortier, Judge of the Probate Court of the County of Morrison, Minnesota, has heretofore filed with the undersigned Governor of the State of Minnesota his written application for retirement, said application having been made under and pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Sections 490.11 and 490.12, Subdivision 1 (1969), and the said Judge Fortier having indicated in his application that he has become incapacitated physically from performing his judicial duties during the remainder of his term of office and, whereas Judge Fortier's attending physician has recommended that he be granted disability retirement at this time and, whereas the undersigned, upon investigation, has determined that Judge Fortier has such physical disability that he has become incapacitated physically from performing his judicial duties, and that the public service is suffering and will continue to suffer by reason of such disability and, whereas it appears that Judge Fortier is seventy years of age and has served as Judge of Probate Court of the County of Morrison continuously for approximately fourteen years and, whereas Judge Fortier's present term of office will expire on the first day of January, 1973,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, acting pursuant to the provisions of Section 490.11, do hereby order and direct the retirement of the Honorable Charles A. Fortier, Judge of the Probate Court of Morrison County, Minnesota, for the unexpired portion of his term, and direct that this Order be filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota on December 1, 1971, on which date the said retirement of Judge Fortier shall become effective, and he shall become entitled thereafter to compensation as provided under the provisions of Section 490.12, Subdivision 1.
