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PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS: Minnesota is rich in natural resources, lakes and streams, fields and forests; and
- WHEREAS: the high quality of Minnesota life is founded in our bountiful soil resources and an adequate and pure water supply; and
- WHEREAS: the physical and spiritual well being of every citizen depends on proper soil care and water management; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota's pioneering reputation for water and soil conservation belongs to all its people who support conservation programs founded on the wise use of our soil, water, woodland and wildlife resources; and
- WHEREAS: this year marks the 35th anniversary of the Minnesota Soil Conservation District Act enacted by the Legislature in 1937; and
- WHEREAS: the Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts in cooperation with their National Association is observing Soil Stewardship Week, Sunday, May 7 to Sunday, May 14, 1972;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, in recognition of, and full appreciation for, the accomplishments and bright outlook for the future of the conservation movement in Minnesota and in cooperation with the Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts do hereby proclaim the week of May 7 - 14, 1972 as

in Minnesota and urge the churches, schools, rural and urban civic clubs, organizations and agencies to observe this week with ceremonies and programs stressing the importance of wise and sustaining use of our natural resources for the present and future well being of our people.
