WHEREAS: the scope of MDAA's research program -- which includes construction and support of a major research center, the Institute for Muscle Disease -- also brings hope to millions suffering from related neuromuscular diseases,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Labor Day Weekend, September 2, 3 and 4, 1972, as

"MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY TELETHON WEEKEND"

and call upon all citizens of our State to give full support to the work of Muscular Dystrophy Associations of America, Inc.
