

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: many dentists from the state of Minnesota who believe in prevention of dental disease will join their colleagues from across the nation in Chicago, Illinois, July 23 for the annual convention of the American Society for Preventive Dentistry, and

WHEREAS: chartered in 1960, the purpose of the Society is to inform the public of the means of reducing or eliminating dental disease. Proponents of preventive dentistry believe that more than ninety percent of dental disease can be prevented with proper knowledge and care, and

WHEREAS: prevention can result in a great reduction in suffering and tooth loss as well as reduced need for expensive, repetitive dental restorative procedures and the possible loss of job or income;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim July 23 - 29, 1972, as

in Minnesota. I extend my best wishes to all members of the Society for a most enjoyable and profitable convention and urge all Minnesotans to take every precaution to prevent dental disease.
