PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS: 4-H is an educational program for boys and girls, 9 - 19 years of age encouraging their four-fold development - head, heart, hands and health; and
- WHEREAS: 4-H annually serves 90,000 Minnesota youth regardless of race, sex, creed, national origin or religion in both rural and urban areas; and
- WHEREAS: 4-H members learn through participation in their choice of over 100 projects ranging from plant and animal projects to creative arts and rocketry; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota 4-H'ers participate in summer camping programs, winter leadership retreats, 4-H TV programs, and activities in cooperation with many public and private agencies and organizations; and
- WHEREAS: the Minnesota 4-H program is a partnership involving the United States Department of Agriculture, the University of Minnesota, county governments, and more than 27,000 volunteer adult and junior leaders; and
- WHEREAS: the 4-H program in Minnesota continues to expand and meet the needs of youth with the theme, "A New Day, A New Way,"

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 1 - 7, 1972 as
