PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: the people of Minnesota are grateful to the veterans of the Armed Forces who have performed their duties of citizenship and served courageously in times of national peril; and

WHEREAS: our citizen servicemen are again answering the call of service in defense of our country and its ideals; and

WHEREAS: veterans, their family members and dependent survivors comprise nearly half of the Nation's population; and

WHEREAS: the people of this nation and the State of Minnesota are grateful to the veterans of the Armed Forces who have faithfully performed and continue to perform their duties of citizenship and service in time of peril; and

WHEREAS: the Congress of the United States has declared Monday, October 23, as a legal holiday designated as Veterans Day to honor our Veterans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 23, 1972 as

VETERANS DAY

In Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe this day in appropriate ceremonies expressive of our people's desire for peace and their gratitude to our veterans and our present servicemen who have served and are now serving and sacrificing in the cause of freedom.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-eighth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two and of the State, the one hundred fifteenth.
