PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: Richard Moe, a native son of Duluth, has dedicated a large part of this past decade to advance the liberal cause in Minnesota as represented by the Democratic Farmer Labor Party; and

WHEREAS: since his graduation from the University of Minnesota Law School, he has performed invaluable service in a variety of state party positions including Public Information Director, Finance Director, and most recently, from December, 1969 until December, 1972, as State Chairman; and

WHEREAS: throughout this entire time, he has been a superbly articulate party spokesman, outstanding fund-raiser, a determined warrior in the party's most strife-torn hours, and a craftsman without peer in building and strengthening party organization; and
