and I further suggest that these additional guidelines set down by the Minnesota Department of Public Safety be observed by youngsters: (1) Bring goodles home to be inspected before tasting them; (2) Wear light-colored costumes decorated with reflective tape for greater visibility; (3) Do not wear masks since they tend to restrict vision; (4) Use flashlights ofter dark; (5) If you carry a pumpkin, light it with a flashlight, not a candle; (6) Gross only at corners, never diagonally across an intersection; (7) Look in all directions before crossing the street; (8) Walk, never tan across the street; (9) Walt on the curb, not in the street, until the street is clear to cross; (10) Walk on the sidewalk, not in the street.
