

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: the students of Minnesota State Colleges represent, in a very real sense, the future of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: one purpose of education in a democratic society is to produce citizens capable of participating in and contributing to that society, including the governmental process; and

WHEREAS: all citizens have the right, if not the obligation, to be informed on issues of public concern, and to convey their opinions to their duly elected representatives; and

WHEREAS: students at Minnesota State Colleges have come to play an increasingly significant role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, February 5, 1973, as

MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGE STUDENT DAY

in Minnesota, and do extend to all students visiting the State Capitol a warm and enthusiastic welcome.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State, the one hundred fifteenth.
