WHEREAS: Myrtle Cain as a young woman worked diligently for ratification of the constitutional amendment extending suffrage to the women of Minnesota and this Nation; and

WHEREAS: Myrtle Cain, as one of our state's first woman legislators in 1923, sponsored the first Equal Rights Amendment introduced in the Minnesota Legislature; and

WHEREAS: Myrtle Cain has worked with dedication, integrity and compassion throughout her life to translate liberal goals and objectives, particularly those concerning equal rights for women and equal rights for all Americans, into reality; and

WHEREAS: no state could have a finer symbol of the equal rights movement than Myrtle Cain;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Monday, February 12, 1973 as

MYRTLE CAIN DAY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three, and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
