PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: wildlife has always been a source of beauty, inspiration and enjoyment to the people of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: the mysteries of wildlife are limitless, and there will always be new things each of us can learn about the wild creatures with which we share this earth; and

WHEREAS: each citizen has a solemn responsibility to learn as much as possible about protecting the environment and keeping it healthy for all forms of life; and

WHEREAS: each of us can make a positive contribution to environmental appreciation by discovering the world of wildlife and sharing what we discover with others; and

WHEREAS: the period March 18 through March 24 and the balance of 1973 will be observed throughout our country as a time to gain new understanding of wildlife's needs and to achieve new awareness of the importance of wildlife in our everyday lives;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 18 through March 24, 1973, as

NATIONAL WILDLIFE WEEK

in Minnesots, and urge all citizens to "Discover Wildlife" - for indeed, "It's Too Good To Miss".
