

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: Harvey and Gladys Hambergren have given the best years of their lives to the City of Alexandria, and to that city's futures; and

WHEREAS: the work of Harvey Hambergren as manager of the Alexandria Chamber of Commerce and in many other civic endeavors has contributed directly and importantly to making Alexandria one of Minnesota's most progressive and thriving cities; and

WHEREAS: Harvey Hambergren's ever optimistic fishing reports from Vikingland, his thwarting of the seizure of Big Ole by a large and forbidding foreign presence, the Minnesota Vikings, and his loving guardianship and promotion of the Kensington Runestone has caused his adopted city to acquire a second name, that of Harveyville;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim, Friday, March 30, 1973, as
