PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: *the spirit and quality of life of each human being in a community are greatly dependent upon the degree of equal access to quality housing, to meaningful employment, to equal opportunity in quality education, and to genuinely fair community services; and*

WHEREAS: *the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted on December 10, 1948, states that "All men shall have freedom of residence"; and*

WHEREAS: *the Foundation for Freedom and Democracy in Community Life is currently advancing a program of education in responsible individual voluntary action geared to deepen the channels of expanding individual freedom and democracy in a pluralistic society;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, March 31, 1973, as

FREEDOM OF RESIDENCE DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens, to give appropriate thought and recognition to the invaluable and basic human rights which must be available to all Americans, including equal access to housing, employment, and education.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
