

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: Dorsie W. Willis carried the burden of a dishonorable discharge from the United States Army for 66 of his 87 years; and

WHEREAS: the United States Army at last admitted its mistake and awarded Dorsie W. Willis the long-overdue document attesting to "service, honest and faithful" to his country; and

WHEREAS: this apology was gratefully and gracefully accepted by Dorsie W. Willis, but can never lessen 66 years of denial resulting from his dishonorable discharge; and

WHEREAS: all of us feel a sense of guilt that such gross miscarriages of justice can happen in the United States; and

WHEREAS: the character, perseverance and courage of Dorsie W. Willis gave him strength through years of struggle; and

WHEREAS: these admirable qualities have been a source of inspiration to his friends and more recently, to people everywhere, who now know the story of Dorsie W. Willis;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, April 19, 1973 to be

DORSIE W. WILLIS DAY

In Minnesota.
