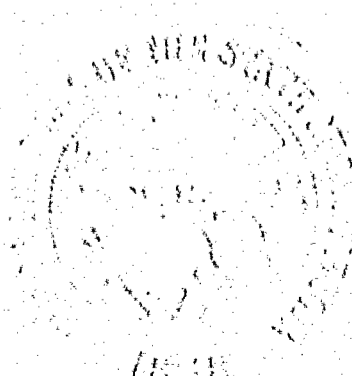

- WHEREAS: Ed S. Miller has served as the eighth General President of the Hotel & Restaurant Employees and Bartenders International Union for 19 years and has been a guiding force in the Union since 1932; and
- WHEREAS: under his leadership, the 31-year-old Hotel & Restaurant Employees and Bartenders International Union, made up of persons of many national origins, has grown in numbers; and
- WHEREAS: Ed S. Miller has fought many battles for his members and has won for them a better life; and
- WHEREAS: in 1959, Ed S. Miller presented to Danny Thomas a check for \$250,000 for the purpose of constructing a hospital wing at St. Jude Hospital, a children's medical research center in Memphis, Tennessee; and
- WHEREAS: this money represented small gifts from thousands of union members in response to a plea by Ed S. Miller, and was the largest contribution to the project; and
- WHEREAS: St. Jude Research Hospital and other humanitarian causes have had the personal support of Ed S. Miller and Hotel & Restaurant Employees and Bartenders International Union members over the years; and
- WHEREAS: the membership of the Hotel & Restaurant Employees and Bartenders International Union is paying tribute to General President Miller, who retired on May 1, 1973, by again contributing to the St. Jude Hospital fund; and
- WHEREAS: Ed S. Miller is being honored tonight, June 14, 1973, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, at a testimonial dinner, the proceeds of which will be added to contributions and sent to St. Jude Research Hospital;
