WHEREAS: autistic children are consistently denied the right to proper education because there are so few resources available; and

WHEREAS: it is imperative that all parents of autistic children know there is a National Society for Autistic Children and that a Twin Cities chapter is located in St. Paul; and

WHEREAS: this organization is endeavoring to meet the special educational needs of the autistic child;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 24 through June 30 to be
