



Proclamation

WHEREAS: the burden on employers and employees of the State of Minnesota resulting from personal injuries and illnesses arising from work situations is substantial; and

WHEREAS: the prevention of these injuries and illnesses is an important objective of the government of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: the greatest hope of attaining this objective lies in programs of research and education, in the earnest cooperation of government, employers and employees; and

WHEREAS: a program of regulation and enforcement is a necessary supplement to these more basic programs; and

WHEREAS: the State of Minnesota has been a pioneer in the field of occupational, safety and health;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of June 4 to June 8, 1973 as

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH WEEK

in Minnesota, and do urge its observance in all work places emphasizing the significance of preserving our human resources.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirtieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
