

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: the greatest and most basic resource of the State of Minnesota is the

health and well-being of its citizens; and

WHEREAS: the family doctor and personal physician represents the means by which

this vital resource is best conserved and extended; and

WHEREAS: for several decades the medical profession of Minnesota has been in

the forefront of leadership of the ongoing effort to protect and enhance the quality, knowledge and skills of the family practice of medicine, through continuing education programs and through the Minnesota Academy of Family Physicians and the American Academy of

Family Physicians; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota physicians with their colleagues from across the nation will

meet at the Mayo Clinic October 29 - 31 and November 5 - 7, 1973 for the General Practice Review as part of the lifelong postgraduate education process which equips the Doctor of Medicine for maximum effective care

of his patients;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 28 through November 3, 1973 as

FAMILY PRACTICE WEEK

and urge all Minnesotans to safeguard their precious heritage of good health by placing themselves under the regular preventive and therapeutic care of a personal or family physician.
