



Proclamation

WHEREAS: work-life patterns are becoming more and more difficult to predict, it is essential that the public be helped to develop flexibility which will permit career changes several times in a working life; and

WHEREAS: rapid technological advances and the unrest of society, the skills of parents may be less relevant and useful to their children in choosing a career; and

WHEREAS: there is a need to interpret the many choices available to the public as well as interpreting vocational guidance services to the public. We continue to stress National Career Guidance as an annual focal point in these efforts because it brings concentrated attention to the importance and values of career education;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 11 - 17, 1973 as

NATIONAL CAREER GUIDANCE WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens of the State to observe this week by making themselves better acquainted with career guidance and its purposes and programs by visiting their schools or by participating in their area.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
