



Proclamation

WHEREAS: *the Women's Conference of the National Safety Council represents some 40 members at large and 59 national and international women's organizations with an outreach to 50 million women; and*

WHEREAS: *the Women's Conference has recognized the need for, and initiated, a National Crusade to bring back Safety on the Streets (S.O.S.); and*

WHEREAS: *the Safety on the Streets Crusade represents an action-oriented program for volunteers nationwide who marshal the human resources of their communities and public service, civic, fraternal, and law enforcement agencies to create safe neighborhoods; and*

WHEREAS: *Safety on the Streets is a citizens' program to deter accident and assault and to engender a love of life rather than a fear of death; and*

WHEREAS: *program aspects of S.O.S. include automobile, bicycle, pedestrian, personal, and school safety, with public support being urged for alcohol and drug counter-measures, national highway safety standards, and improved street lighting;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 28 - November 3 as

SAFETY ON THE STREETS WEEK

in conjunction with the 17 Annual Meeting of the Women's Conference of the National Safety Council in the City of Chicago, and in recognition of the outstanding contribution to communities throughout the nation of volunteer womanpower, united to bring back Safety on the Streets.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
