



Proclamation

WHEREAS: aviation has experienced continued growth in Minnesota and in 1972 an estimated 11 million passengers were enplaned and deplaned at Minnesota's 143 public airports; and

WHEREAS: aviation has established an enviable safety record and accounts for less than three percent of the fatalities in all modes of transportation; and

WHEREAS: improvement in aviation safety will result in saving of life and property to the benefit of the public; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota Department of Aeronautics and the Federal Aviation Administration work closely with the aviation public and industry to promote safety; and

WHEREAS: the active involvement of the aviation public is necessary for the success of this effort; and

WHEREAS: a better safety record can be achieved by improvement of airmen's attitudes, skills, judgment and knowledge;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of December 1973 as

AVIATION SAFETY MONTH

in Minnesota and recommend the participation of every pilot in promoting aviation safety by taking a proficiency evaluation flight.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
